Reporting potholes on surrounding public roads ...

We've recently noticed a number of potholes developing on the public roads surrounding our private estate. As these roads fall under the responsibility of the local councils (not the Estate), it's important that any issues are reported directly to them so they can take appropriate action.

If you come across a pothole, please take a moment to report it using the links below. Including a photograph and precise location details greatly helps the councils assess the issue and prioritise repairs:

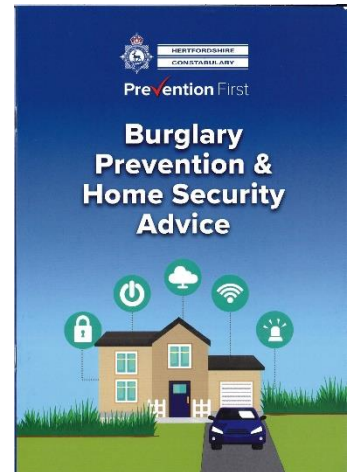
